2. Read lines 6–7.
Explain the function of these lines in the development of the writer’s argument. You should make reference to the passage in your answer. 2

3. Read lines 8–13.
By referring to **at least two** examples, analyse how the writer uses language to convey the impact of the car on Chinese life. 4

4. Read lines 14–22.
By referring to **at least two** examples, analyse how the writer uses both imagery **and** sentence structure to convey a negative view of the car. 4

5. Read lines 23–32.
Explain fully why the writer believes the age of the car is over. Use your own words in your answer. 3

6. Read lines 33–39.
By referring to **at least two** examples, analyse how the writer uses language to convey dissatisfaction with car use. 4

7. Read lines 40–47.
Explain fully the measures being taken in major cities to reduce car use. Use your own words in your answer. 3

8. Read lines 48–54.
By referring to **at least two** examples, analyse how the writer uses language to create a forceful tone. 3

9. Look at both passages.

Identify **three** key areas on which they agree. You should support the points you make by referring to important ideas in both passages.
