Choose **one** of the following two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: Society

Last year you went to see your brother who was working as a language teacher in France. On your return you were asked to write an account of your experience, in **French**, for your school/college website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- how you got on with the people you met
- what you liked/disliked about the area
- what you did in the evenings
- where you went on your brother's days off
- whether you would consider working in another country in the future.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

SCENARIO 2: Culture

While on holiday in France during the summer you went to a food festival in a neighbouring town. On your return you were asked to write an account of your experience, in **French**, for your school/college website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where exactly the festival was **and** how you got there
- what you thought of the food you tried
- what other things you could see or do in the town
- how you got on with the people you met
- what gifts you brought back to Scotland
- whether you would recommend this kind of experience.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
